1. Fledgling (Verb) –

Meaning: a person or organization that is immature, inexperienced, or underdeveloped.

Synonyms: emerging, emergent, arising

Antonyms: declining, mature, ripening,

Usage: “the country’s fledgling democracy”

2. Conceded (Verb) –

Meaning: admit or agree that something is true after first denying or resisting it.

Synonyms: admit, acknowledge, accept

Antonyms: deny, Disavow, Disaffirm

Usage: “I had to concede that I’d overreacted”

3. Jolt (Noun) –

Meaning: push or shake (someone or something) abruptly and roughly.

Synonyms: push, thrust, jar

Antonyms: disadvantage

Usage: “a surge in the crowd behind him jolted him forwards”

4. Rout (Noun) –

Meaning: a decisive defeat.

Synonyms: getaway stampede, debacle

Antonyms: victory

Usage: “the party lost more than half their seats in the rout”
